## Services

The London Hazards Centre provides a unique set of services to those who need professional help with health and safety issues. Organisations helped include:

- journalists throughout the print and broadcast media
- local authorities setting standards for safe systems of work
- trade unions combating hazardous working conditions
- community groups protecting their local environment
- lawyers pursuing personal injury compensation and community hazards cases

# RESEARCH

London Hazards Centre's library, built up over 10 years, has been designated a *Practical Information Centre* for the World Health Organisation's International Programme on Chemical Safety.

#### The Centre has:

- access to major national and international health and safety and medical databases
- a specialist library with information from around the world and an extensive database of health and safety literature
- a network of contacts in trade unions, non-government organisations, academic and medical organisations
- staff who combine technical skills with experience of providing practical advice to workers and community groups

### Topics

The Centre has access to information and skills covering a vast range of health and safety topics. Examples include:

- toxic substances solvents, pesticides, paints, asbestos, manufactured mineral fibres, dusts, cleaning agents
- safety data sheets accessing, interpreting and assessing manufacturers' information
- pest infestations cockroaches, pharaoh's ants, fleas, rats
- occupational diseases lung diseases, repetition strain injuries (RSI), cancer, noise-induced hearing loss, dermatitis, asthma
- hazardous working conditions dusts, chemicals, sick building syndrome, poor lighting, VDUs, ergonomics, photocopiers, ventilation
- community pollution contaminated land, water pollution, industrial pollution, waste disposal, redevelopment, electromagnetic fields
- the law European Community directives and their implementation in Britain, the new "six pack" of regulations, UK law, safety representatives' rights, safety policies

The Centre specialises in the control and substitution of hazardous substances, and has developed chemicals policies for local authorities and assisted in their implementation.

# Inspections & RISK ASSESSMENT

Many workplaces are badly designed with little attention to ergonomic considerations and the health, safety and welfare of the people who work in them. The London Hazards Centre carries out inspections of workplaces and makes written recommendations on improvements in line with the law and best practice.
